

- a member of Prizmah: Center for Jewish Day Schools, a network that provides professional development, research data and resources for Jewish day schools across North America.












Our Enrolment

Over the last few years, our total enrolment numbers have remained very consistent. The most important story is our strong retention, which is well above the typical independent school standard of 90%. We have seen a consistent long-term trend of reduced student attrition (students departing Gray Academy to other schools in Winnipeg), along with growth in High School enrolment. Overall, these figures tell us that families who choose Gray Academy are committed to a long-term, significant investment in Jewish day school education for their children.

Our Finances

PREPARED BY DIANE SHINDLEMAN, TREASURER

The Finance Committee continued its focus on financial stability and sustainability for our first full post-pandemic school year. We are pleased to share that the deficiency of \$25,160 in our 2022-2023 financial statements represents a positive improvement over our budgeted deficiency of \$47,015. It was a year of renewal with school trips and extra curricular activities returning to enhance our students' experiences.

We continued to work on our financial sustainability goal and our requirements under the Canadian Accredited Independent Schools (CAIS) Financial Standard. To that end, we celebrated Gray Academy's 25th anniversary with a modest fundraising campaign. We are grateful to those who acknowledged this milestone with a donation.

AJCC License Agreement

We continue to operate under an Asper Jewish Community Campus licence agreement that expired in 2017. Further steps to finalize a new agreement continued during the year.

Our New "Old" CFO

We were thrilled to confirm that Carlos Benesdra has joined the Winnipeg Board of Jewish Education (WBJE) as our Chief Financial Officer. For the last several years, Carols has divided his CFO role between the Jewish Federation of Winnipeg (JFW) and the WBJE. This continuity is very important to the school's financial operations, and we are pleased to have Carlos focusing entirely on the school's requirements.

New Treasurer

We are pleased to announce the appointment of Zach Donen as our next WBJE Treasurer and Chair of the Finance and Audit Committees. Zach is a CPA and a graduate of Gray Academy (Class of 2014).

Community Support

We acknowledge with gratitude the support we received in 2022-2023 from the JFW. These vital funds are used specifically for our needs-based bursary program, which enables more families to access Jewish education for their children.

We are also grateful for the endowments and grants we received from the Jewish Foundation of Manitoba and the Province of Manitoba. We have been able to continue with some fantastic programs and support for our families thanks to donations received during the year. We thank all our donors for their generosity and support.


We thank everyone on both the Finance and Audit Committees for volunteering their time and expertise.


The WBJE financial statements included in this report are audited by Booke and Partners.

Winnipeg Board of Jewish Education Inc. Note to the Summarized Financial Statements

June 30, 2023

1. Basis of preparation

The summarized financial statements have been prepared from the audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2023 on the following basis:

a) The summarized financial statements include the major totals and subtotals from the related complete financial statements dealing with matters having a pervasive or otherwise significant effect on the summarized financial statements.

Our Strategy

Developing a new Strategic Plan was a top priority in 2022-2023, and much of the work took place during that time. Our year-long consultative process included input from the WBJE, senior leadership, faculty, staff, parents and students.

DEVELOPING OUR PLAN

MARCH - JUNE 2022

Board & Faculty Kick Off/Data Review

Future Design School, our partner in this process, worked with our board, faculty and staff to kick off the process with workshops and community focus groups to understand the essence and ethos of our school. Existing data from all areas of the school were reviewed, including recommendations from our most recent CAIS accreditation.

SEPTEMBER - DECEMBER 2022

Community Consultation

Extensive community consultations, including one-on-one interviews, anonymous surveys, and discussions with a dedicated committee generated substantial feedback from students, parents, teachers, faculty and staff.

JANUARY - FEBRUARY 2023

Insight Review & Analysis

Together with the Strategic Planning Committee, the WBJE reviewed the insights provided by the broader school community and worked on actioning feedback.

MARCH 2023

Aspirations & Goal Setting

Internal stakeholders at the school were invited to provide feedback on an initial draft developed by Future Design School and our Strategic Planning Committee.


APRIL - JUNE 2023


